


Kaharoa School Board Update

Schools across our region are encouraging families to talk to their children about vaping. These products are easily accessible and young people need to know the key facts and risks.

- Explain that vaping is potentially less harmful than smoking, but only for smokers who want to quit.
- Vaping is not for non-smokers, especially children and young people.
- Explain that some vapes contain nicotine and that nicotine is a highly addictive substance which is very hard to stop once you've started.

At Kaharoa School, like other schools in our area - finding a student vaping at school is cause for concern and likely to be responded to as a health issue initially with a strong warning. Repeated vaping at school is a harmful and dangerous example and may invoke more serious disciplinary action likely to be a stand down which is reported to the Board and MOE and may lead to suspension.

Note: trading, sharing with others, or selling vapes to students puts others at immediate risk and will invoke immediate serious disciplinary action likely to be a stand down or suspension.
